Donations from Individual Retirement Accounts

Parish members at least 70 ½ years of age may treat donations made directly from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to the Church as a nontaxable IRA distribution. Such a transaction is called a Qualified Charitable Contribution (QCD).

A QCD is excluded from taxable income up to \$100,000 per year and will count towards a required minimum IRA distribution. (The amount may increase to \$105,000 in 2024.) The donation cannot be claimed as a deduction because the distribution is excluded from taxable income. The Church will provide the appropriate acknowledgement for tax documentation.
